**Edmonds CC is on a quarter hour credit system which SNHU converts to a semester credit system as follows: 5 cr = 3.33 cr; 3 cr = 2 cr; 2 cr = 1.33 cr. This will leave .33 credits for each course, totaling 2.93 credits, that will not fit into SNHU degree requirements.*

*Courses at Edmonds CC that transfer as a block may satisfy some SNHU courses as direct equivalents. Students will work with an academic advisor upon enrolling to make that determination. Free Electives can then be taken at SNHU to make up the remaining credits within the block of 63.

SNHU accepts up to 90 credits towards a bachelor's degree. Should a student decide to take additional courses at Edmonds CC beyond the associate's degree to maximize transfer credits, the following courses are recommended and they will only transfer if taken AFTER the associate degree is conferred. This will leave 30 credits remaining for students to complete at SNHU for their BS Culinary Management (2+2) degree.
